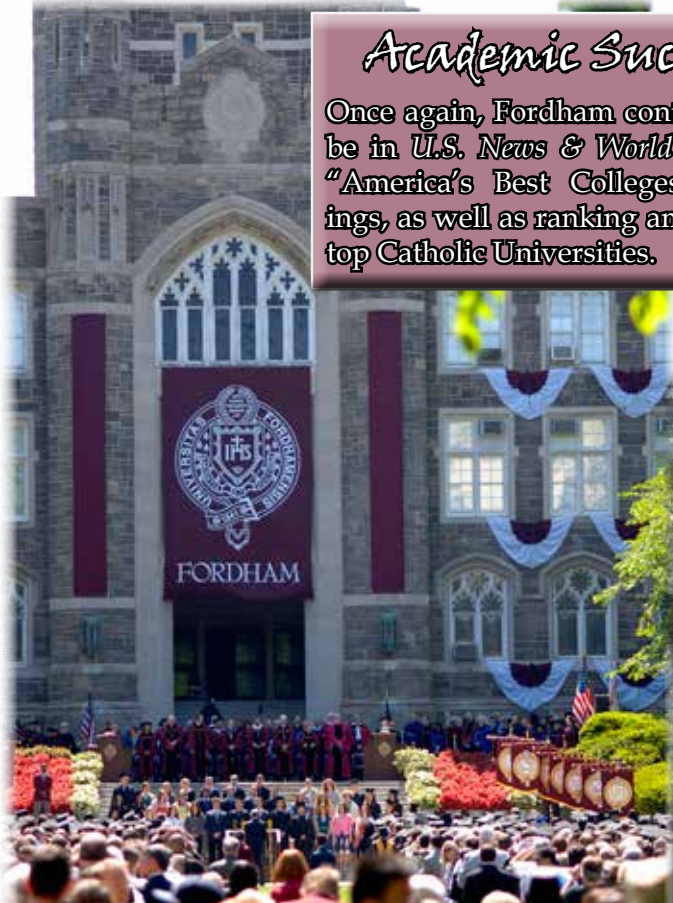
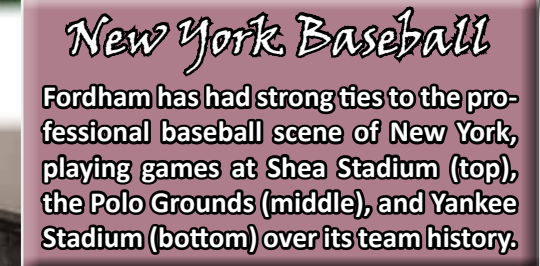

Fordham boasts a number of players that have been drafted and signed by Major League Baseball teams, and gone on to have very successful professional careers. (Far left) Frankie Frisch, "the Fordham Flash", had a Hall of Fame career with the New York Giants and St. Louis Cardinals, while Johnny Murphy (middle left) pitched in six World Series as an ace reliever with the New York Yankees. Hank Borowy (middle right) pitched for over a decade with five clubs, including the New York Yankees and Chicago Cubs, and was the last Cubs' pitcher to win a World Series game prior to 2016, while Pete Harnisch (middle right) is the only 1st round draft pick in team history and went on to win 111 games over 14 seasons and was an All-Star selection in 1991. Nick Martinez made the big leagues in 2014 with the Texas Rangers, while Brett Kennedy is the latest Ram to make the majors with the San Diego Padres in 2018.

Directions to Fordham/Houlihan Park

GPS Address: 2853 Southern Boulevard, Bronx, NY, 10458

From Upstate NY and Rockland County: NY State Thruway South to the Tappan Zee Bridge. Take Exit 8 onto Rt. 287 (Cross-Westchester Expressway). Take Exit 3 onto the Sprain Brook Parkway South (to NYC). Sprain Brook Parkway turns into the Bronx River Parkway. Take Exit 7W / Fordham Rd. (US 1). Proceed west for approximately 1/4 mile. The New York Botanical Garden will be on your right. Stay to the right, avoiding the underpass. At the light, turn right onto Southern Blvd / Dr. Theodore Kazimiroff Blvd. After 1/4 mile, turn left into the University.

From New England: Via Rt. 84: Follow Rt. 84 West to Brewster, NY. Exit to 684 South. 684 changes to the Hutchinson River Parkway South. Exit to Pelham Parkway West. Pass the exits to the Bronx River Parkway (the New York Botanical Garden will be on your right), and stay to the right, avoiding the underpass. At the light, turn right onto Southern Blvd / Dr. Theodore Kazimiroff Blvd. After 1/4 mile, turn left at the light into the University.

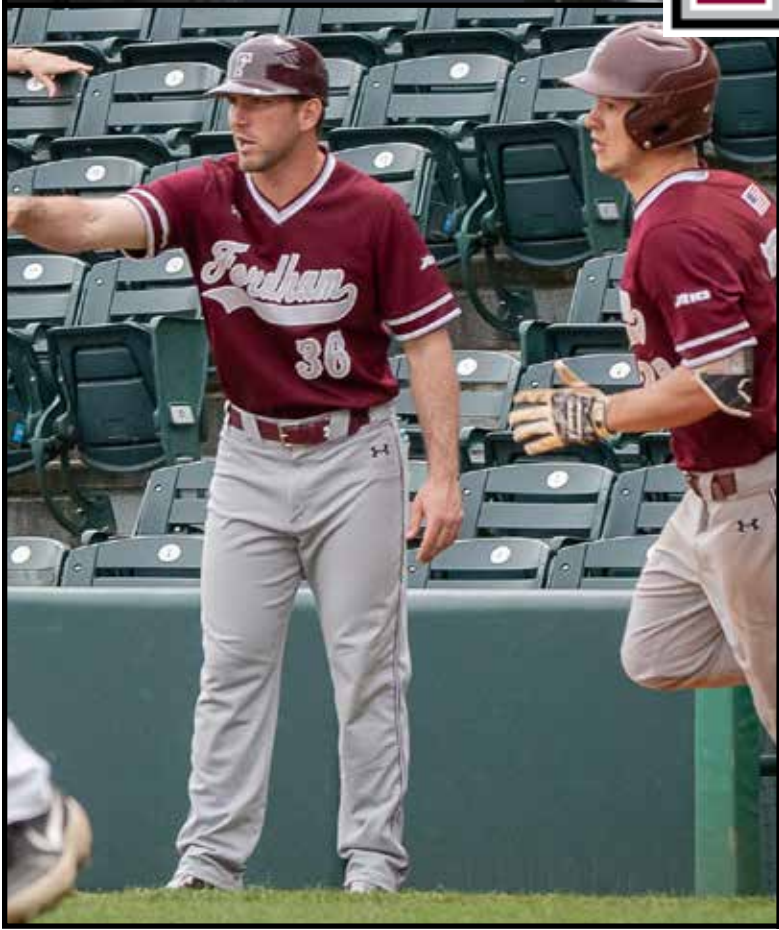
From New England: Via I-95: Follow I-95 South to Exit 8C/Pelham Parkway West. Pass the exits to the Bronx River Parkway (the New York Botanical Garden will be on your right), and stay to the right, avoiding the underpass. At the light, turn right onto Southern Blvd. / Dr. Theodore Kazimiroff Blvd. After 1/4 mile, turn left at the light into the University.

From the George Washington Bridge: Off the bridge, take the exit for the Henry Hudson Parkway North (1st exit from the Bridge). Follow the Henry Hudson Pkwy North to Exit 24, Moshulu Parkway. Stay on the Moshulu Parkway to the end (the New York Botanical Garden will be in front of you). Take a right onto Southern Boulevard. Fordham's main entrance is at the third light. Turn right into campus.

From Long Island: Take the Whitestone Bridge to the Hutchinson River Parkway North. Exit at Pelham Parkway West. Follow Pelham Parkway West for approximately 2 miles. Pass the exits to the Bronx River Parkway (Botanical Garden will be on your right), and stay to the right, avoiding the underpass. At the light, turn right onto Southern Blvd / Dr. Theodore Kazimiroff Blvd. After 1/4 mile, turn left into the University.

Directions to Houlihan Park: As you enter campus, parking garage is on your left and Houlihan Park is on your right.





The Coaching Staff



Head Coach Kevin Leighton Ninth Season Seton Hall '01

Guiding the Rams is head coach Kevin Leighton.

Leighton, the head baseball coach at Manhattan College for six years, was named head baseball coach at Fordham University it was announced in July 2011 by Executive Director of Athletics Frank McLaughlin.

"We are excited to find a coach with the experience and accomplishments of Kevin Leighton," said McLaughlin. "We have a proud and successful baseball tradition at Fordham and look to Kevin, with the support of our alumni, to build on that success and the winning traditions."

The culmination of Leighton's tenure at Fordham came to fruition in 2019, as the Rams captured the Atlantic 10 Championship for the second time in program history and made its first NCAA appearance since 1998. Fordham once again led the nation in stolen bases for the second consecutive with a school record total of 178, while also setting the modern day program record for wins in a season (38) and strikeouts (605).

Individually, pitcher John Stankiewicz was named Third Team All-American by Collegiate Baseball, the NCBWA, and the ABCA, after being selected as the Atlantic 10 Pitcher of the Year. He also earned First Team All-Atlantic 10 honors along with teammate Kyle Martin, while Jason Coules was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team. Martin was then the latest draft pick for Fordham, taken in the 15th round by Baltimore. Two other pitchers, Anthony Zimmerman (Cincinnati) and Anthony DiMeglio (Milwaukee) would go on to sign free agent contracts.

In 2018, the team finished with 35 wins, the most for the program since the 2007 season, and tied for second in the Atlantic 10 standings. The Rams also set a number of records throughout the year, which included team records for stolen bases, leading the NCAA with 169, strikeouts, surpassing the old mark by over 100 with 536, and saves (20) in 2018. Other team records set were runs in a single game (29 vs. Saint Peter's) and strikeouts in a game (21 vs. Hofstra). Fordham also had four players reach 20 stolen bases in the same season for the first time in team history.

Leighton's Rams were also honored with a number of awards throughout 2018, led by Jake MacKenzie, who was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Year, a Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-American, First Team All-Atlantic 10, and First Team All-ECAC. MacKenzie also joined Ben Greenberg on the ABCA/Rawlings All-Northeast Region Second Team, while also being one of three Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team selection with fellow freshman Joseph Quintal and C.J. Vazquez. Billy Godrick also added to the awards list earning Academic All-Atlantic 10 honors. Fordham also had another player drafted in the 2018 MLB Draft, as Reiss Knehr was taken in the 20th round by the San Diego Padres after ranking in the top ten in career ERA and strikeouts at Fordham.

In 2017, the team finished with an overall winning record for the first time since 2011, and set the pitching record for strikeouts in a season for the third consecutive year with 414. Individually, the Rams had a First Team All-Atlantic 10 pitcher in Jimmy Murphy, who was drafted in the eighth round of the 2017 MLB Draft by the Baltimore Orioles, making it the third consecutive season that a Fordham pitcher has been drafted. The season also marked the first time since 2011 that a Fordham player earned Freshman All-American status as pitcher Kyle Martin was honored by Baseball America and pitcher Alvin Melendez was honored by the NCBWA. In addition, both Martin and Melendez were named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team, giving Leighton at least one All-Rookie Team selection in each of his six seasons at Fordham. Fordham also had a pair of Atlantic 10 All-Academic selections in Matthew Kozuch and Jason Lundy, making it three straight seasons with multiple players selected.

The Rams continued their improvement in Leighton's fifth season at the helm,

posting 29 wins, the most by Fordham since 2011, and 14 conference wins to finish fifth in the standings and earn the team's third straight trip to the Atlantic 10 Championship. Individually, six Rams earned Atlantic 10 honors, which included Second Team All-Atlantic 10 outfielder Mark Donadio and All-Rookie Team selections Justin Bardwell and Reiss Knehr. Fordham also had multiple players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft for the second straight year with Greg Weissert going to the New York Yankees in the 18th round and Joseph Serrapica to the Tampa Bay Rays in the 24th round. On top of these accomplishments, the Rams' pitching staff broke the team record for strikeouts in a season for the second straight year with 408, marking the first time Fordham has reached the 400-plateau.



In 2015, Leighton saw the Rams make their second straight appearance in the Atlantic 10 Championship, while five players earned conference honors, which included First Team All-Atlantic 10 catcher Charles Galiano and All-Rookie Team selection Ben Greenberg. Leighton also saw two of his original recruiting class be drafted, as pitcher Brett Kennedy was selected in the 11th round by the San Diego Padres and Galiano was picked in the 40th round by the Milwaukee Brewers. Additionally, his pitching staff broke the team record for strikeouts in a season with 392, surpassing the 1999 mark of 387, while the Rams led the Atlantic 10 in stolen bases (97) and stolen bases per game (1.80) for the second straight year and ranked in the top 20 nationally in both categories.

In 2014, Leighton coached the Rams to their first Atlantic 10 Championship appearance in four seasons, where the Rams picked up their first tournament win since 2007. Fordham also saw a number of award winners throughout the 2014 campaign, as four players earned All-League honors, marking the first time since 1997 that Fordham had four players honored by the Atlantic 10. The award winners included two All-Atlantic 10 selections (Tim Swatek - First Team; Joseph Runco - Second Team), two All-Rookie Team picks (Mark Donadio and Kirk Haynes, Jr.), an All-Academic selection (Runco), and an ECAC All-Star (Swatek - Second Team).

In Leighton's first season at Fordham, the Rams finished with a .500 record or better for the fourth straight season in conference play, while having two players, Ryan Maghini (Second Team All-Atlantic 10) and Matthew Cianci (All-Rookie) receiving All-League honors. He also brought in a large recruiting class for the 2013 season, which included one of them, Charles Galiano, being drafted out of high school by the Philadelphia Phillies. Year two under Leighton saw the 2013 class shine as Joseph Runco was named to the All-Rookie Team, while a total of four freshmen saw action in over 50 games.

Leighton, who won more than 30 games in each of his six seasons as head coach with the Jaspers, became the head coach at Fordham after one of his most successful seasons, leading Manhattan to its second MAAC Championship and second appearance in the NCAA tournament in 2011. The Jaspers finished the season with a 34-19 record

with six players earning All-MAAC honors, including the MAAC Pitcher of the Year. Manhattan also had four players named to the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Northeast Region Team. Leighton was also honored, being named the Anaconda Sports MAAC Coach of the Year after guiding the Jaspers to the regular season crown with a 20-2 conference record.

"I am extremely excited to have the opportunity to lead such a prestigious baseball program with a rich tradition at a great school like Fordham," said Leighton. "I am very appreciative to everyone at Fordham for giving me this opportunity and I'm looking forward to getting the program to the top of the Atlantic 10."

In Leighton's second year at the helm of the Jaspers, he led the team to its first MAAC championship and an appearance in an NCAA Regional as the Jaspers advanced to the regional final in 2006. Manhattan won 34 games that year, including three wins over nationally ranked opponents, most notably, #6 Nebraska in the NCAA Regional. Leighton was recognized that year as the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year.

Leighton, the third winningest baseball coach at Manhattan, had a 200-119-1 career record as head coach. He has mentored 51 All-MAAC recipients since joining the program in 2002, including 32 First Team selections. During his tenure, four Jaspers were named MAAC Pitcher of the Year, two earned MAAC Rookie of the Year honors, one was selected MAAC Player of the Year and one was recognized as MAAC Relief Pitcher of the Year. Additionally, two Jaspers received All-America honors and seven were named Louisville Slugger Freshman All-Americans. Eleven players Leighton coached at Manhattan have advanced to the professional ranks.

Manhattan's baseball success wasn't limited to the playing field as 49 Jaspers earned MAAC All-Academic status since 2006. In 2008 Manhattan was honored with an NCAA Public Recognition Award for ranking in the top-10 percent of all Division I baseball programs in the multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) report.

In 2008 and 2009, the Jaspers won back-to-back MAAC regular season

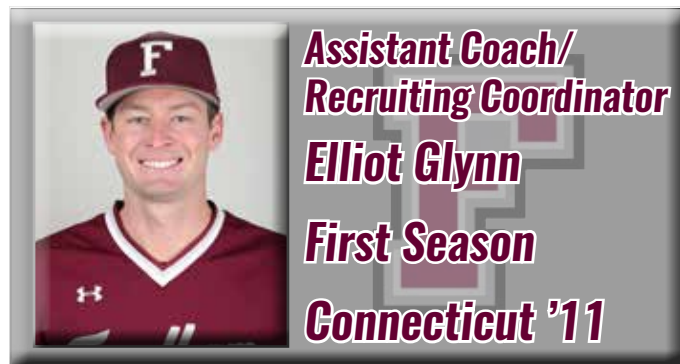
championships with Leighton being named 2009 MAAC Coach of the Year after Manhattan tied a program record notching 35 wins with one of the most powerful offenses in conference history. The 2009 Jaspers finished fifth in NCAA Division I and set the conference's single season record with a .349 team batting average. Manhattan also set MAAC records with 657 hits and 130 doubles in a season.

Leighton guided the 2008 Jaspers to the program's first MAAC regular season title since joining the league in 1982. In 2007, the Jaspers set a school record with 35 wins, and advanced to the MAAC Championship game for the third time in the previous four seasons. The team also tallied a program-best 21 MAAC wins, including a 19-0 start to the conference season. Manhattan compiled a 16-game overall and 15-game road win streak, both of which were tops in Division I at the time.

Prior to taking over as head coach, Leighton served as an assistant coach at Manhattan from 2002-04. Leighton arrived in Riverdale after a standout four-year career at Seton Hall University. He helped the Pirates to back-to-back NCAA Regional appearances in 2000 and 2001. In 2001, he helped guide the Pirates to the Big East Championship, the program's first title since 1987.

Leighton earned his bachelor's degree in health and physical education from Seton Hall in 2001. He completed his master's degree in administration and leadership in education at Manhattan in 2005.

The Brewster, N.Y., native was drafted by the Philadelphia Phillies in 1997. He and his wife, Katie, have two daughters, Taylor and Madelyn, and a son, Owen.



Elliot Glynn is the latest addition to the Fordham baseball coaching staff as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator.

Glynn comes to Rose Hill after five seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Hartford, where he assisted with recruiting, oversaw Hartford's pitching staff, and helped the Hawks break a handful of records during his time with the team.

In 2018, the Hawks' pitching staff had a stellar season helping the team to its first America East Regular Season and Tournament Championships. The staff struck out the most batters in program history (405), while also setting a team mark for most innings (476.2) and had the fourth lowest ERA in program history. Highlighting the season was Nicholas Dombkowski, who became the first player in America East history to be named conference's Rookie and Pitcher of the Year, and went on to earn Baseball America Freshman All-American honors. Glynn also saw right-handed pitcher Seth Pinkerton drafted in the 20th round by the Minnesota Twins.

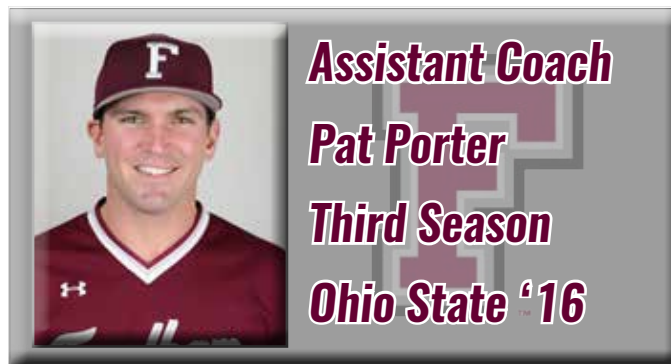
In 2017, Glynn's pitchers combined to rack up the third-most strikeouts in a single season in Hartford history, with 324. While setting the program record for wins (37) in 2016, the Hawks also ranked second all-time in team ERA (4.33), one spot ahead of the 2015 staff (4.36). Under Glynn's supervision, Hartford's pitchers cracked the program's all-time top five in innings pitched, runs allowed, strikeouts, shutouts, saves and batting average against.

Prior to Hartford, Glynn was an assistant coach at Siena College. He helped guide Siena to the 2014 MAAC Championship and a win against Dallas Baptist in the Fort Worth Regional of the NCAA Tournament.

Glynn, who signed with the Milwaukee Brewers in 2011, played collegiately at the University of Connecticut, where he was a two-time captain for the Huskies. In 2011, he helped lead the squad to the NCAA Super Regionals and, one year prior to that, he helped the Huskies to a school-record 48 wins. He still among the Huskies' leaders in all-time innings pitched, games started, wins, and strikeouts.

As a freshman designated hitter, Glynn earned All-New England honors and in 2010 received Second Team All-Big East and All-New England distinction as a pitcher. He also played two seasons in the Cape Cod Collegiate Baseball League, where he earned a nod to the 2009 All-Star game at Fenway Park.

A Long Beach, Calif., native, Glynn was drafted three times before signing with the Brewers. He spent two seasons in the Brewers' farm system before playing one year in Germany. A 2011 graduate of the University of Connecticut, he holds a degree in Education.



After a brief stint with Manhattan College in the fall of 2018, Pat Porter is back for his second stint with the Fordham baseball coaching staff, having previously served as a volunteer assistant coach in spring 2018.

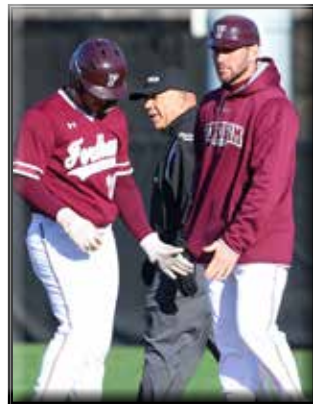
"Pat is going to be a huge help for me, my staff, and our players. He will be responsible for a lot of the behind the scenes, day-to-day tasks of running this program. He brings high level playing experience, tremendous energy and work ethic, along with the desire to learn every day," said Fordham head baseball coach Kevin Leighton.

In 2019, the Rams captured the Atlantic 10 Championship for the second time in program history and made its first NCAA appearance since 1998. Fordham once again led the nation in stolen bases for the second consecutive with a school record total of 178, while also setting the modern day program record for wins in a season (38) and strikeouts (605).

Individually, pitcher John Stankiewicz was named Third Team All-American by Collegiate Baseball, the NCBWA, and the ABCA, after being selected as the Atlantic 10 Pitcher of the Year. He also earned First Team All-Atlantic 10 honors along with teammate Kyle Martin, while Jason Coules was named to the Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team.

In his first season on the staff, the team finished with 35 wins, the most for the program since the 2007 season, and tied for second in the Atlantic 10 standings. The Rams also set a number of records throughout the year, which included team records for stolen bases, leading the NCAA with 169, strikeouts, surpassing the old mark by over 100 with 536, and saves (20) in 2018. Other team records set were runs in a single game (29 vs. Saint Peter's) and strikeouts in a game (21 vs. Hofstra).

Porter came to Fordham after spending 2017 as an operations intern for the Ohio State baseball team, where he also played for the Buckeyes from 2012-15. He was a First Team All-BIG TEN outfielder in 2015, and was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 15th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He has spent the last three seasons in the Astros minor league system, most recently playing for Buies Creek in the Carolina League in 2017.

Jared Franklin joined the Fordham baseball coaching staff as a volunteer assistant coach in 2019.

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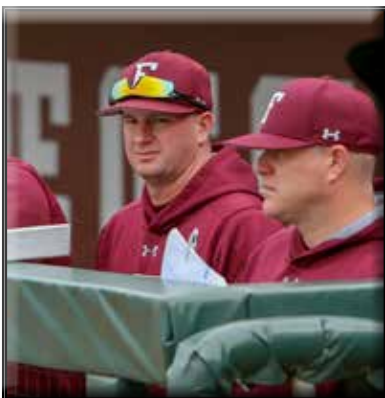
Franklin comes to Rose Hill after serving as the hitting coach at Lake Erie College for two seasons (2016-2018). While at Lake Erie, Franklin guided the offense to the second most hits in school history in 2016 with 446.

Prior to Lake Erie College Franklin served as the Head Coach at Webster County High School in Kentucky for two seasons (2015-2016), Franklin has had several coaching stops, serving as an assistant coach at Defiance College (2014), Southeastern Illinois College (2013), Texas A&M International University (2010-11), and Ohio Wesleyan University (2008-10).

He has also been in charge of a number of summer programs, acting as head coach of the Madisonville Miners for four seasons (2013-2017) and the Cheyenne Grizzlies (2013), while serving as a baseball coach at the IMG Academy in 2012. While heading the Miners, Franklin lead the team to the two highest win percentages in franchise history in 2015 and 2016. In Cheyenne, Franklin lead to Grizzlies to the 2013 Mountain College League title.

Since beginning his coach career, Franklin has had 24 for players sign professional contracts including three to reach the Major League level.

Franklin earned his associate degree from Columbus State Community College in 2001 in architecture, a bachelor's degree in cross disciplinary studies from Ohio Dominican University in 2009 and later a MBA from Lake Erie College in 2018.

Tony Mellaci, who served as an assistant coach at Fordham and as Director of Baseball Operations over three decades of service at Rose Hill, moves into the role of special assistant to the head coach in 2018. Over the past 30 years, he has directed the infield play and the defense, served as first base coach, and championed Fordham's strong recruiting program, which has brought some of the finest players coming out of high school and junior colleges to Rose Hill, served as a community service contact with youth programs, as well as with the Fordham baseball alumni base.

Along with 2005 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year Nick Restaino, Mellaci helped the Rams have a resurgent year in 2005, posting 34 overall wins and 17 conference wins. The 34 wins were the most since the 1997 campaign, while the 17 conference victories were the most by Fordham since joining the Atlantic 10 in 1995-96.

As a member of the Atlantic 10, Mellaci has helped Fordham to the Atlantic 10 Tournament on four occasions, including the 1998 title. Mellaci has also helped coach ten All-Atlantic 10 players, two Players of the Year, and two Rookies of the Year.

Among the team accomplishments in Mellaci's tenure, Fordham has had eight 30-win seasons, and captured seven league titles (3 - MAAC, 3 - Patriot League, 1 - Atlantic 10).

Prior to Fordham, Mellaci's first significant stop was at Westchester Community College where he was the head coach for five years. His club won four Mid-Hudson Conference Championships, in the process notching 106 wins against just 43 losses for a better than .700 winning percentage. This stretch was highlighted by a 30-4 record in 1981, when the diminutive general led his troops to a National Junior College World Series appearance.

Mellaci moved to Iona College following the 1983 season and not coincidentally, the program turned around. He helped the Gaels to two MAAC titles in the mid-1980's, including an ECAC playoff bid in 1985. Mellaci served as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the New Rochelle, NY school for four years before joining Fordham's staff in a similar role in 1987.

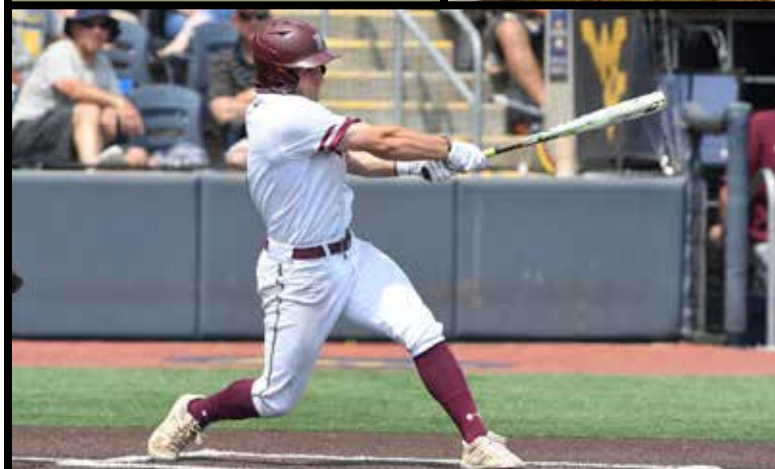
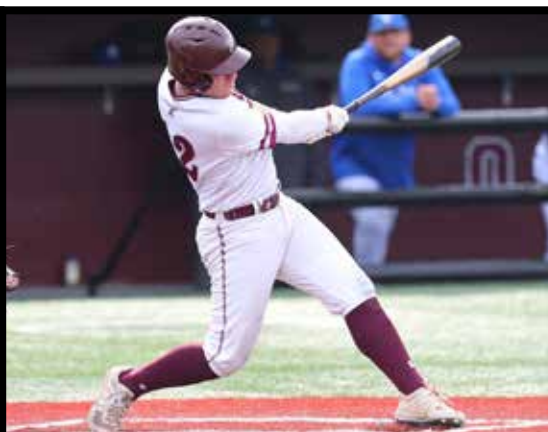

**2019 Atlantic 10 Baseball Champions - Fordham Rams**

It was a magical four-day run at the 2019 Atlantic 10 Baseball Championship with different heroes each day, as the Fordham Rams captured their second league title and first since 1998 in front of the home crowd at Houlihan Park.

Here's how it all went down:

Game 1: Fordham 7, Richmond 6 (10 innings)

Trailing 6-1 in the bottom of the sixth, the Fordham Rams put together their biggest comeback of the season, defeating the Richmond Spiders, 7-6, in ten innings on the opening day of the 2019 Atlantic 10 Championship.

Richmond opened the scoring in the second inning, scoring a pair of runs. The Spiders picked up a pair of walks and an RBI-single by D.J. Lee for the first run, while the second came in on a sacrifice fly.

Fordham cut the deficit in half in the third, scoring a single run, making it, 2-1. Billy Godrick reached base on an error to start the inning and moved to second on a sacrifice. After a single by C.J. Vazquez pushed Godrick to third, Jason Coules lifted a sacrifice fly to center to score Godrick.

The Spiders regained a two-run lead in the fourth on an RBI-single by Jordan Schulefand and then increased the lead to 4-1 on another RBI-single by Schulefand in the sixth. Richmond continued to add to the lead in the sixth, scoring runs on a bases loaded walk and a ground out for a 6-1 advantage.

The Rams rallied back for two runs in the bottom of the sixth. Jake MacKenzie got things going with a two-out walk and moved to second on a single by Matt Tarabek. Justin Bardwell then drilled a single up the middle to score MacKenzie from second. Nick Labella followed with an RBI-double down the right field line, scoring Tarabek to make it a 6-3 game.

Each team then threatened to score in the seventh as both loaded the bases. However Fordham's Gabe Karlso struck out the final Richmond batter to leave them loaded, while Richmond's Antonio Balducci got out of a bases loaded jam with no outs to keep Fordham at bay.

The Rams though would break through to tie the game at six in the eighth. Fordham loaded the bases with no outs and got a two-out single by Jake Baker to pull within one at 6-5. After a sacrifice bunt got a runner to third, Coules lifted his second sacrifice fly to score Godrick from third and tie the game at six.

The teams each had opportunities to score in the ninth, but the bullpens held up forcing extra innings. In the bottom of the tenth, Vazquez led off with an infield single and moved to second on an error. After a ground out moved Vazquez to third, MacKenzie delivered the walk-off single to right, giving Fordham the 7-6 come from behind win.

For Fordham, Kyle Martin (6-2) earned the win in relief, striking

out three in 1.1 innings of work. Karslo tossed two innings of hitless relief with three strikeouts as well for the Rams. At the plate, Vazquez recorded his first career four-hit game, going 4-for-5 with a run scored, while Baker was 2-for-4 with two RBI. Bardwell and Labella each finished with two hits in the game with Coules adding a pair of RBI.

Game 2: Fordham 2, VCU 1

Behind strong pitching from their two First Team All-Atlantic 10 pitcher and some clutch defense, the Fordham Rams defeated the VCU Rams, 2-1, on day two of the 2019 Atlantic 10 Championship.

Fordham started the scoring right away in the first inning. C.J. Vazquez led off with a ground rule double to left and moved to third on a sacrifice bunt by Jason Coules. One out later, Alvin Melendez laced a single to left, scoring Vazquez for a 1-0 lead.

VCU answered with a run in the bottom of the frame, as Brett Norwood hit a solo home run to center, his sixth of the year, tying the game at one.

Fordham regained the lead in the fourth inning, when Melendez drew a walk, stole second, and scored on an errant pickoff throw to second.

The Maroon and White then flashed the leather to keep the one-run lead. Melendez made a jumping catch in right field for the first out of the fourth, while Billy Godrick robbed Steve Carpenter of a potential home run in left center field for the second out. Then in the eighth inning, with two on and two outs, VCU's Paul Witt hit a high chopper off the plate that Matt Tarabek fielded and fired to first to Nick Labella to keep the Fordham lead at 2-1.

The game then went into an hour and 17 minute weather delay, before resuming with the ninth inning. Fordham's Kyle Martin then struck out the side in the ninth to post his tenth save of the season, tying his career-high. He finished with four strikeouts in two innings of relief. Starter John Stankiewicz (8-3) got the win, allowing just one run on three hits over seven innings to go with five strikeouts. The five strikeouts gave Stankiewicz 102 strikeouts for the season, becoming the fourth Ram to reach the century mark in a season, joining Cory Riordan (2007), Hank Borowy (1939), and Dick Egan (1909).

At the plate, Melendez was 2-for-3 with a double, a run scored, an RBI, and a stolen base, while Jake Baker had a hit and two stolen bases. With the three stolen bases, Fordham has broken its team stolen base record with 172 this season, moving past last season's mark of 169.

Game 3: Fordham 4, Dayton 2

Though only six runs came across the plate, it was a wild and turbulent

opening game on day three of the 2019 Atlantic 10 Baseball Championship. In the end, Fordham's Jason Coules drove in the go-ahead run in the eighth inning, while Nick Labella drove in the other three runs, as the Rams defeated the Dayton Flyers, 4-2, to advance to the Atlantic 10 Championship final.

With the win, Fordham won its 37th game, breaking the modern day school record of 36, set in 1988 and 1990.

Fordham got things rolling in the second inning, as Matt Tarabek was hit by a pitch and moved to second on a ground out. Nick Labella followed with an RBI-double to left center, scoring Tarabek for a 1-0 lead.

The score looked to go to 2-0 in the sixth inning, when Jake MacKenzie hit a fly ball to center with C.J. Vazquez coming home from third base on a sacrifice fly. However, Dayton appealed the play and Vazquez was called out for leaving early.

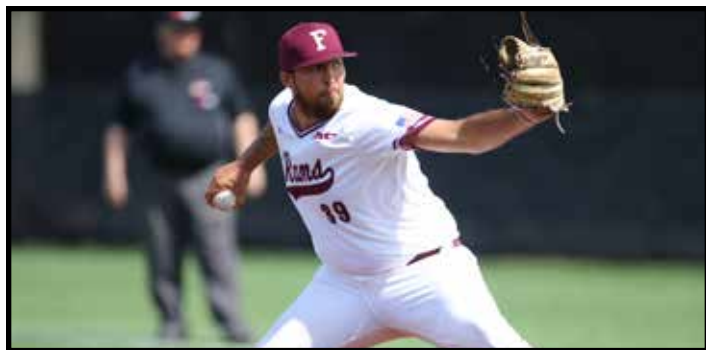
Dayton then took the lead in the bottom of the inning, scoring twice for a 2-1 lead. The Flyers loaded the bases with Connor Wilson hitting a ground ball up the middle. MacKenzie tagged second for one out, but couldn't make the relay throw, getting by Labella at first and allowing two runs to score.

Fordham answered back in the seventh, tying the game at two. Alvin Melendez led off with a single, stole second, and moved to third on a failed pickoff attempt. After a walk to Tarabek, Labella put down the safety squeeze bunt to score Melendez and tie the game.

The Rams then regained the lead in the eighth and added an insurance run in the ninth for a 4-2 lead. Jake Baker lined a leadoff single to right in the eighth and was sacrificed to second. Jason Coules followed with an RBI-double to left center, scoring Baker for the lead. In the ninth, Tarabek singled, was sacrificed to second, and scored on a single by Labella.

Facing Fordham's Anthony Zimmerman, Dayton was able to get the tying run to the plate, but Fordham turned a 5-4-3 double play and got a ground out to third to complete the 4-2 win.

Anthony DiMeglio earned the win, improving to 6-3 on the year, allowing one earned run on six hits over seven innings with six strikeouts. Zimmerman recorded his third save, as he struck out two in two innings. At the plate, Labella was 2-for-3 with a double and three RBI, while Tarabek was 1-for-2 with two runs scored.

Game 4: Fordham 4, Dayton 3 (12 innings)

It was high drama all game long, featuring gutsy pitching, stellar defense, and clutch hits in the 2019 Atlantic 10 Baseball Championship game. However, it was the keen eye of Fordham senior catcher Justin Bardwell that capped the game, as he drew a bases loaded walk to force in the winning run, giving the Rams a 4-3 win over the Dayton Flyers and the team's second ever Atlantic 10 Championship title.

With the win, Fordham received the Atlantic 10's automatic bid

into the NCAA Championship, which will be the team's eighth appearance overall and first since 1998.

"I'm so proud of our guys and the way they played this week. This team has fought so hard all year and I'm beyond happy for them," said head coach Kevin Leighton after the game. "Watching them celebrate on the field and be the last team standing was amazing. Our players, our coaching staff, and alumni deserved this."

On Championship Saturday, Fordham started the scoring in the first without the courtesy of a hit. With two outs, MacKenzie drew a walk and moved to second on a wild pitch. MacKenzie then stole third, his 43rd stolen base of the season, where the throw was errant to third from the pitcher, allowing MacKenzie to score.

The Rams made it 2-0 in the fifth inning. Billy Godrick reached on a bunt single and moved to third on a Jake Baker single. Vazquez then plated Godrick from third with a sacrifice bunt.

Fordham tacked on to the lead in the sixth. Matt Tarabek drew a walk, while Justin Bardwell and Godrick were both hit by a pitch to load the bases. Baker then singled up the middle to score Tarabek for a 3-0 edge.

Dayton then rallied for two runs in the seventh inning, cutting the Fordham lead to 3-2. The Flyers picked up a run on an error as well as a sacrifice fly by Alex Brickman.

The score held there until the ninth, as with two outs, Dayton's Brickman hit a solo home run to left center off Fordham closer Kyle Martin, his seventh of the season, to tie the game and force extra innings, marking the third time that the Atlantic 10 Championship final has gone to extra innings (1985 and 2008).

Martin would go on to keep Dayton in check for two more innings, pitching a career-long 4.2 inning to the 12th inning, when Cory Wall took over and got a 1-2-3 inning for the Rams.

Then in the bottom of the 12th, the Rams got things started with a one-out single by Jason Coules and a walk to Jake MacKenzie. Alvin Melendez then singled sharply to left to load the bases with one out. After a strikeout, Justin Bardwell drew a five-pitch walk from Dayton reliever Cole Pletka to force in Coules to score the championship winning run. With the game going 12 innings, it is the longest Championship title game in conference history.

Wall (3-1) was credited with the win, following Martin's 4.2 innings of work with four strikeouts. Matt Mikulski started the game, going the first 5.1 innings, allowing four hits and three walks with six strikeouts. At the plate, Coules was 2-for-6, scoring the game-winning run, while Baker was 2-for-4 with an RBI. Melendez added two hits and a stolen base as well offensively.

Following the game, Nick Labella was named the Championship's Most Outstanding Player for both his offensive and defensive prowess during the Championship, while Labella, Martin, Melendez, and Vazquez were selected to the All-Championship team.

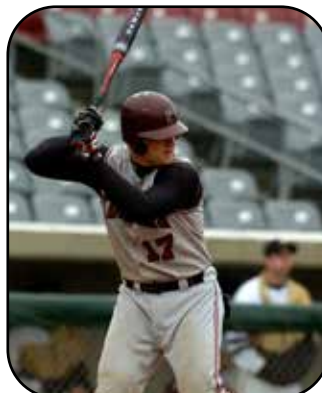

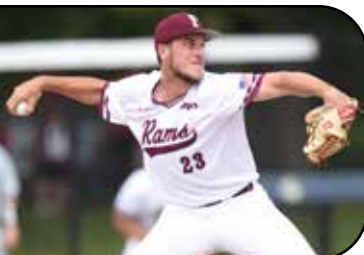

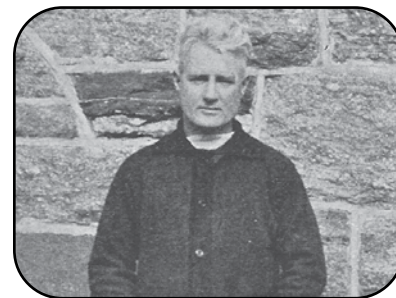

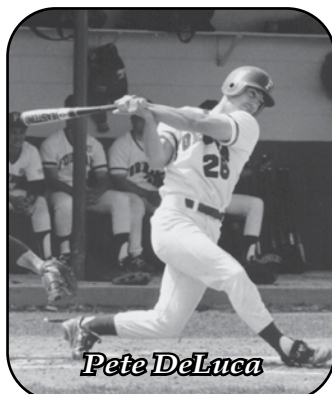
FORDHAM ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME

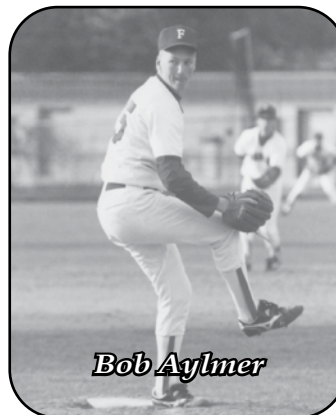

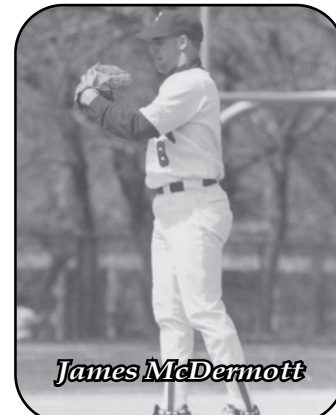

The Fordham Flip

There have been plenty of defining moments in Fordham Athletics history that will always be looked to and one of those fantastic moments happened ten years ago. It's simply known as the "Fordham Flip," making Fordham shortstop Brian Kownacki, a household name and an Internet sensation.

"The play and video still follows me around today. I know that early in my career, it helped open some doors for me. It is one of many fond memories I took away from my time at Fordham," said Kownacki remembering the play.

Fordham trailed Iona by a 9-1 score after five innings, when a massive rally literally flipped the outcome of the game. The comeback in the eighth was capped off by an incredible effort by Kownacki which would not be forgotten.

"I was supposed to be on the bench that night taking an off day. It was a rough start, but we started to chip away at the lead and we could feel the momentum shift as it got later into the game. Looking back I think that play highlights a major team comeback against a local rival and that's what made it special," said Kownacki.

Chris Walker, who had pinch-hit earlier in the eighth inning, came up again and blasted a single to left center with the bases loaded for the go-ahead hit. Matt DeSilva and Stephen McSherry scored easily, as Iona's Anthony Muccio misplayed the ball in center.

Kownacki was waved around all the way from first with the low throw coming into Iona catcher James Beck, beating Kownacki to the plate. Kownacki then leaped completely over the top of Beck without a tag, and landed with a handstand on home plate, capping off a nine-run inning, giving Fordham its first lead of the game at 12-9. The crowd in attendance went crazy, not just for the comeback effort by the Rams, but the amazing play they just witnessed.

"The jump was a split second reaction that I couldn't tell you as to why I did it. After scoring I don't remember seeing the umpire give the safe call but just remember celebrating with my teammates."

The Kownacki leap was then cut as a highlight and sent into the ESPNEWS News Desk for the top plays of the night. By the end of ESPN's Baseball Tonight's midnight broadcast, there was Kownacki's highlight on national TV, sneaking on as the final piece of the show, as John Kruk, Bobby Valentine and Aaron Boone were all in awe, saying they hadn't seen that before. ESPNEWS also ended their hourly broadcast with the clip, as ESPNEWS anchor and Fordham alum Michael Yam said, "That's how we do it at Fordham."

The showings of Kownacki's jump then created a surge of interest across news and sports broadcasts the following morning, as the live morning SportsCenter had re-ranked the top plays, moving the highlight to #1. ESPN's First Take then called to interview Kownacki on their show, which was just the beginning of a week-long media storm around the shortstop.

The "Kownacki Kraze" found its way onto national television appearing on Live with Regis and Kelly, Fox 5's Good Day NY, ABC's Jimmy Kimmel Live and Good Morning America, NBC's Today Show, MLB Network's MLB Tonight, and ESPN's Pardon the Interruption, Around the Horn, and SportsNation.

Kownacki was eventually brought on for live interviews on Inside Edition, FoxNews' America's Newsroom, the CBS Early Show, the PIX Morning News, and MLB Radio Network's Talkin' Baseball with Fordham alum Ed Randall.

The highlight had become a "viral video", was dubbed the "Fordham Flip", and the craze around it continued to grow. MLB Network named the highlight the Play of the Week and April's Offensive Play of the Month, while the Harlem Globetrotters gave Kownacki a "Trotter Tribute" award for a "Globetrottersque play."

The highlight earned Kownacki a trip to the ESPY Awards in Los Angeles, where "the Flip" finished second in the vote for the Best Play of the Year ESPY Award, while at Cartoon Network's Hall of Game Awards, he received the Most Viral Player Award for best amateur sports video.

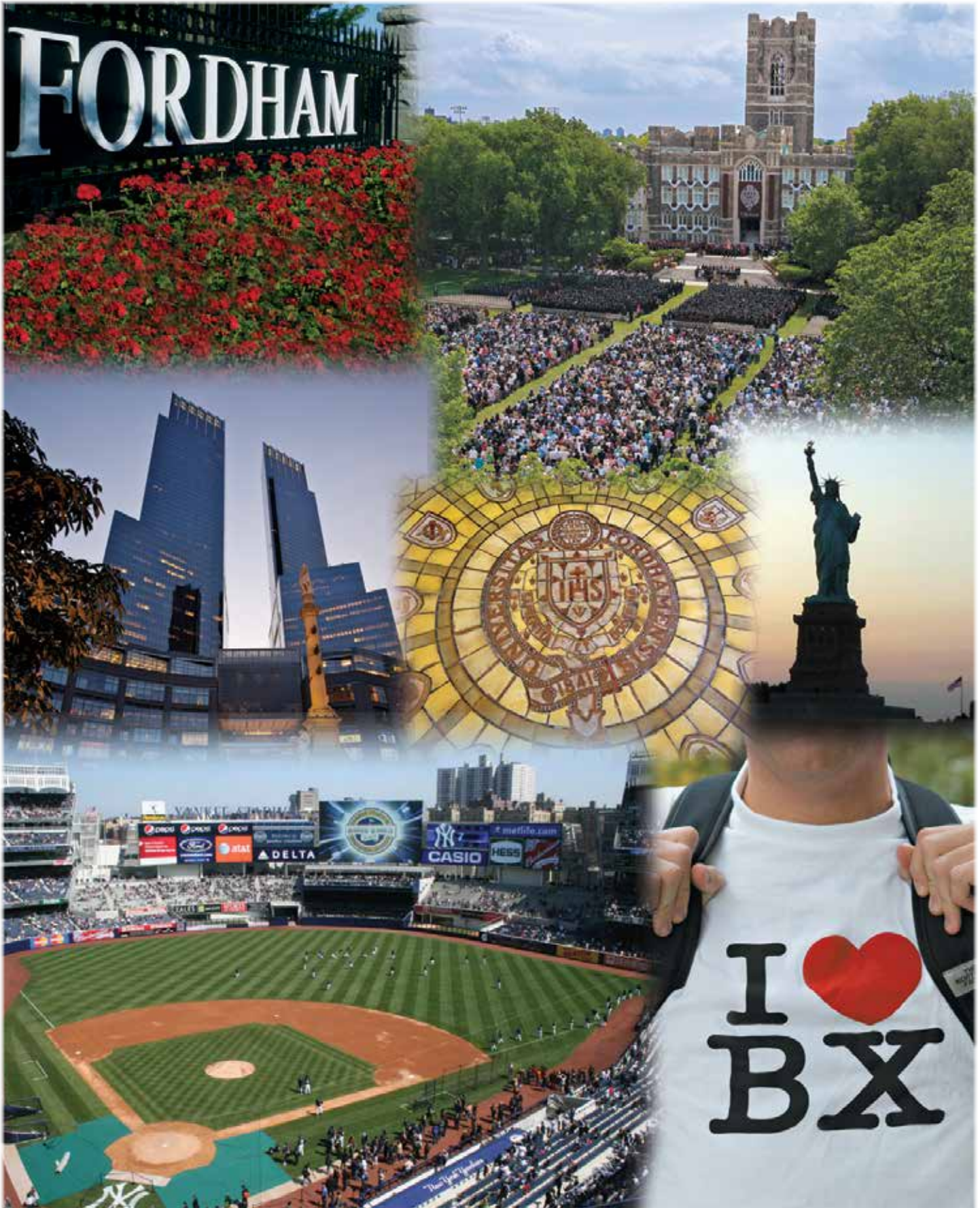

Founded in 1841, Fordham is a Jesuit, Catholic university with a spirit that comes from the nearly 500-year history of the Society of Jesus. It's the spirit of full-hearted engagement—with profound ideas, with communities around the world, with injustice, with beauty, with the entirety of the human experience. A Fordham education shapes the whole person; members of the University community are asked to be men and women for others and to put their education in service to the common good.

Fordham is a highly selective national university that combines the benefits of a research university with the student-centered education of a small liberal arts college. The University comprises three undergraduate colleges, five graduate and professional schools, and the Gabelli School of Business, which offers undergraduate- to doctoral-level programs. Students choose from more than 60 majors in the liberal arts, sciences, performing arts, and business, and complete a rich core curriculum that spans literature, history, science, theology, philosophy, and the arts.

Special offerings include honors programs, involvement in original research, dual-degree programs with Fordham's graduate and professional schools, and pre-professional programs in architecture, law, medicine, and other health professions. Every year, about 125 undergraduate students receive training in journalism and related trades at WFUV, Fordham's award-winning public media service. The University offers access to study abroad programs in more than 55 countries, on six continents, including the London School of Economics and La Sorbonne in Paris.

Fordham students run more than 160 clubs and organizations—award-winning newspapers and celebrated musical groups, ambitious academic societies, and vibrant cultural groups. A few examples: Mimes and Mummers is one of the nation's oldest collegiate theatrical troupes, and the top-ranked Fordham Debate Society is the eighth oldest collegiate debate society in the United States.

History

Educating for over 175 years, Fordham was founded as St. John's College, the first Catholic institution of higher learning in the Northeast. Fordham's founder, Archbishop John Hughes, was seeking to provide opportunity to Catholics and immigrants during a time of anti-Catholic animus in New York City and nationwide. The University's tradition of serving first-generation students continues today: first-generation students make up 18 percent of the Class of 2019.

The Jesuit University of New York

As the Jesuit university of New York, Fordham blends a rigorous curriculum and a student-centered approach with the resources, culture, and energy of New York City. Fordham students serve as interns at the United Nations and are mentored by CEOs of Fortune 500 companies. They choose from more than 2,600 internship opportunities in business, communications, education, government, health care, biomedical research, law, the arts, and other fields. The University's many academic partnerships in New York City include the Bronx Science Consortium, which brings Fordham together with three of its neighbor institutions in the Bronx to foster scientific innovation. Fordham also offers a BFA in dance through a unique partnership with The Ailey School in Manhattan.

The University has two residential campuses in New York City: The Rose Hill campus in the Bronx is adjacent to the New York Botanical Garden and the Bronx Zoo, and the Lincoln Center campus is located in the cultural heart of Manhattan, next to Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts. In 2014, a state-of-the-art

residential tower for 430 undergraduates opened atop the new Fordham Law School building on the Lincoln Center campus. The University also has a campus in Westchester County, just outside New York City, and a biological field station—the Louis Calder Center—in Armonk, N.Y.

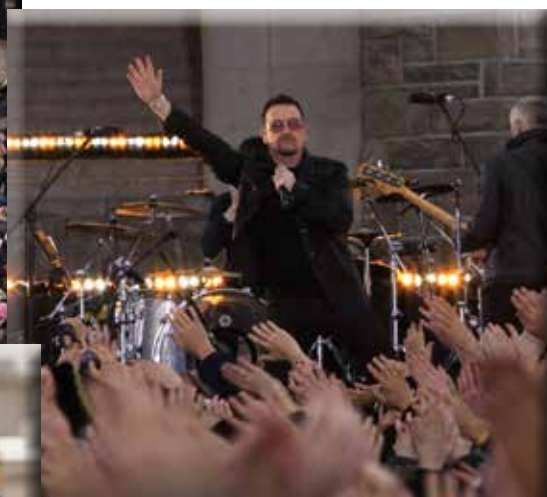
Fordham maintains robust service programs in both New York City and around the world. The University's Global Outreach program runs cultural immersion and service projects in approximately 30 locations worldwide.

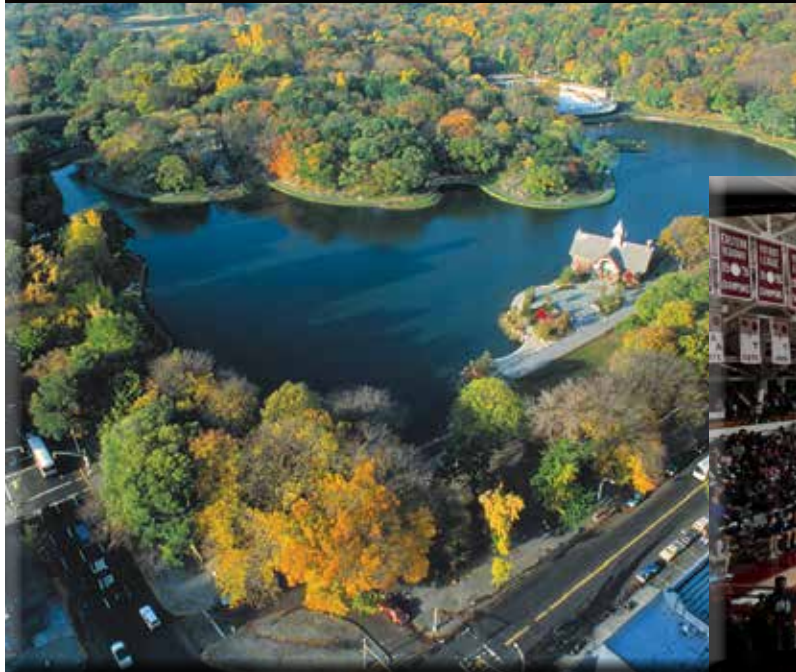

From the Seven Blocks of Granite to the Digger Phelps "Rams." From Frankie Frisch to Olympic gold medalist Tom Courtney to major league pitcher Pete Harnisch. From Mike Marchiano, a 1997 Baseball All-American, to NCAA soccer scoring champion John Wolyniec, to Bobby Kingsbury, the first Atlantic 10 baseball player to earn Player of the Year honors twice, to Jen Mineau, a two-time Softball All-American, and Brienne Ryan, a U.S. Olympic qualifier in swimming, Fordham University Athletics has enjoyed a tremendous amount of success on the local and national playing fields.

Fordham currently sponsors 22 men's and women's varsity sports teams. On the men's side the Rams field teams in baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, indoor and outdoor track, soccer, swimming and diving, squash, tennis and water polo, while the women compete in basketball, cross country, indoor and outdoor track, soccer, rowing, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, and volleyball.

Last year, marked the 24th season of competition in the Atlantic 10 Conference for the Rams, who were a member of the Patriot League for the previous five years (the Rams are still affiliated with the Patriot League for football). In 24 years as a member of the Atlantic 10, Fordham has come a long way in all sports with women's basketball and baseball each earning their second conference championship, while softball won its eighth Atlantic 10 championship in the last nine seasons in 2019. The Rams now have 16 league titles among softball (eight), men's soccer (three), baseball (two), women's basketball (two), and women's swimming & diving in the Atlantic 10.

Additionally, the football squad won its third Patriot League title in 2014, joining the 2002 and 2007 team, and have reached the NCAA playoffs five times (2002, 2007, 2013, 2014, and 2015). In rowing, the women's lightweight four has medaled multiple times at the IRA National Rowing Championships (2008, 2012, and 2013) with the women's freshmen four winning the gold medal at the 2012 Dad Vail Regatta and the women's club 4 taking gold at the 2014 Head of the Charles. Also, men's cross country team won back-to-back IC4A championship in 2013 and 2014, with the golf team winning the 2009 ECAC Championship and the water polo team capturing a share of the 2009 CWWA Northern Division regular season title. In addition, the squash team won the Chaffee Cup at the CSA Team Championship in 2019.

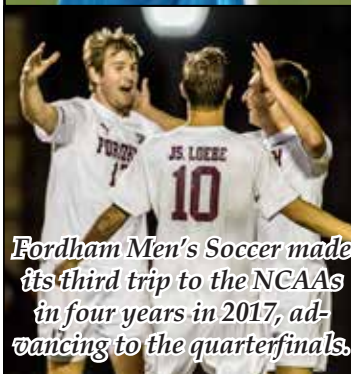

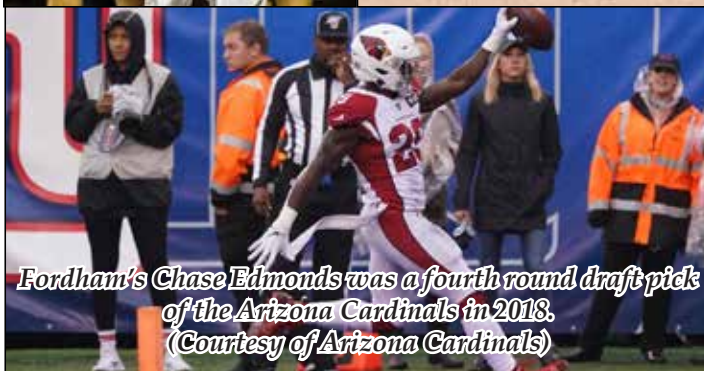

Success for the Fordham student-athlete is not only found on the fields and courts. It's also seen in the classroom. Last year, 325 student-athletes were named to the Atlantic 10 Commissioner's Honor Roll, which led all Atlantic 10 schools, for having a 3.0 GPA or better for the semester and 35 more were named to the Patriot League Honor Roll for football, while 11 water polo players received ACWPC All-Academic honors.

On the national level, Fordham had a CoSIDA Academic All-America® honoree in five of the last six years, the last being women's swimming's Nele Albers in 2018. This success is nothing new to Fordham as the Rams have had 33 student-athletes earn Academic All-America® honors since 1968. The Rams did have four Academic All-District selections for 2018-19 with football's Bryce Petty, women's soccer's Clara Gastaldi, men's swimming's Christopher Sleutjes, and baseball's Billy Godrick..

Locally, the Rams had 17 student-athletes named to their respective Atlantic 10 or Patriot League All-Academic teams. Additionally, the men's and women's swimming and diving programs were named CSCAA Scholar All-America, while the men's and women's cross country and track & field teams were honored as USTFCCCA All-Academic Teams. The men's and women's soccer teams both received the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award with the women's tennis team earning the ITA All-Academic Award, the baseball team receiving the ABCA Team Academic Excellence Award, and water polo garnering the ACWPC All-Academic Team Award.

In the spring of 2019, eight Fordham teams were publicly recognized by the NCAA for posting multi-year APR scores in the top ten percent of all squads for their respective sport. The Rams were third among Atlantic 10 institutions for the number of teams honored.

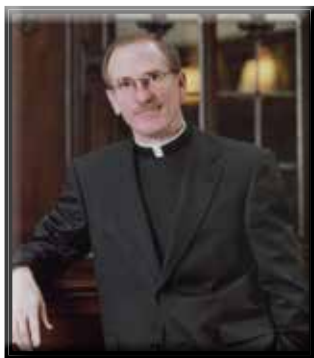

Joseph M. McShane, S.J.

University President

The Reverend Joseph M. McShane, S.J., became the 32nd president of Fordham University on July 1, 2003. His appointment as president marked his return to the University, where he had previously served as Dean of Fordham College, a professor of theology and a member of the Board of Trustees.

A native of New York City, Father McShane entered the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) in 1967 and was ordained a priest in 1977. He received a Bachelor's degree in English and philosophy and a master's degree in English from Boston College, and he holds a Ph.D. in the history of Christianity from the University of Chicago. He earned M.Div. and S.T.M. degrees from the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley.

He has served on the religious studies faculty at LeMoyne College in Syracuse, N.Y., from 1982 to 1992, and as chair of LeMoyne's Department of Religious Studies from 1991 to 1992. Father McShane joined the Fordham University Board of Trustees in 1987 and served until 1992, when he was appointed Dean of Fordham College and professor of theology. In 1998, Father McShane left Fordham to become president of the University of Scranton in Pennsylvania. He was reappointed to Fordham's Board of Trustees in 2001. In 2003, he left the University of Scranton to return to Fordham.

Father McShane has served on the boards of Fordham University, the Metropolitan Transportation Authority Financing Commission, the "Preserving the Vision" Blue Ribbon Committee for the Diocese of Brooklyn, Loyola University of New Orleans, the University of Scranton, St. Joseph's Preparatory School in Philadelphia, Fordham Preparatory School, Canisius High School, Scranton Preparatory School, Regis High School and the American Council on Education. He presently serves on the boards of Santa Clara University, the Commission of Independent Colleges and Universities, Canisius College and the Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Jeffrey Gray

Vice President for Student Affairs

Jeffrey L. Gray was appointed Vice President for Student Affairs at Fordham University on July 1, 1996. He began at Fordham as the Assistant Dean of Students for Residential Life in September 1989, and was named Dean of Student Life in August 1990. In June, 1997, Gray assumed the additional responsibility of advancing the University's Department of Intercollegiate Athletics and Recreation.

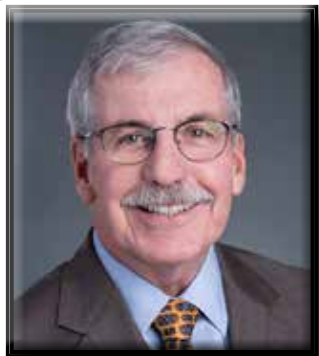
As the chief student affairs officer for Fordham University, Gray oversees all student affairs functions at the Rose Hill and Lincoln Center campuses of the University, including the Offices of the Deans of Students, the Dean of Student Services, Residential Life, the University Judicial Process, Hospitality and Dining Services, Counseling and Psychological Services, Student Health Services, Career Services, the Offices of Student Leadership and Community Development, Intercampus Transportation, the McGinley Student Center, New Student Orientation, Disability Services, the Alcohol and Drug Education Programs and Intercollegiate Athletics and Recreation.

Under Gray's direction and leadership, several programmatic enhancements have been advanced in support of intercollegiate athletics including multiple capital renewal projects, expanded athletic scholarship initiatives and the addition of several key personnel in the administrative and coaching ranks. At the 2001 Block F Awards Dinner, Gray received the Jack Coffey award, presented annually to a Fordham administrator, alumnus or coach for outstanding contributions and dedication to the athletic program.

As a senior member of the President's Administrative Cabinet, Mr. Gray plays a significant role in the advancement of the University's Strategic Planning process, which has included the advancement of strategic initiatives for student affairs and intercollegiate athletics in support of the University's mission, vision and strategic planning objectives.

Gray received a bachelor of arts in psychology from the State University of New York at Plattsburgh, a master of science in counseling and guidance from Syracuse University and a master of science in administration from Western Connecticut State University. He was director of counseling and guidance for the McGraw Central School System from September 1981 to August 1984, Assistant to the Director of Housing at Western Connecticut State University from September 1984 to December 1987 and the Assistant Director of Residential Life at Montclair State College in New Jersey from 1987 until September 1989.

Gray and his wife, Peggy, have four children, Katelynn, a 2010 Fordham graduate and a member of the 2010 Atlantic 10 Champion women's swimming & diving team, Brendan, Megan (a 2016 Fordham graduate) and Erin (a 2018 Fordham graduate), and they reside in Stamford, Connecticut.

**David Roach****Director of Intercollegiate Athletics**

David T. Roach, who was named the director of intercollegiate athletics and recreation at Fordham in October of 2012, begins his eighth season with the Rams in 2018-2019. Roach, who served as the president of the National Association of Collegiate Athletic Directors in 2010-2011, brought 22 years of experience as an athletic director to Fordham.

Roach has put his mark on the Fordham athletic programs, both on and off the fields of competition. On the playing fields, Roach has overseen the resurfacing of the Murphy Field athletic complex along with Jack Coffey Field and the installation of new chair back seating to the grandstand. In the Rose Hill Gym, a new floor is being installed in 2019 while new seating was installed in the summer of 2017 and two large video scoreboards were added in 2013, allowing high-definition in-game video. In the Lombardi Memorial Center, the women's basketball team received new offices and the playing surface of the fieldhouse was replaced.

The Rams have enjoyed on-field success in Roach's first seven years with 12 Atlantic 10 titles along with one Patriot League championship. Over that time, the Rams have made 16 NCAA appearances and four WNIT bids for women's basketball. Fordham sent three teams to the NCAA Championships in 2013-14 for the first time in school history (football, women's basketball and softball) and followed that with three more in 2014-2015 (football, men's soccer and softball) and again had three teams advance in 2019 (women's basketball, softball and baseball).

Over the past four years, Fordham recorded consecutive seasons with an overall winning record, including a .601 winning percentage in 2016-2017, the highest for the Rams in recent history.

Off the playing fields, Roach teamed with the Janssen Sports Leadership Center to establish the Fordham Leadership Academy for Fordham student-athletes, which aims to cultivate, test and aid the school's student-athletes and coaches as they work towards becoming world-class leaders in athletics, academics and life.

Roach has also been instrumental in athletic marketing initiatives, signing a consulting and sales partnership with Learfield to handle all commercial rights for Fordham as well as partnering with Barnes and Noble to serve as the official online e-commerce vendor for Fordham Athletics.

Roach arrived at Fordham after spending the previous eight years as the director of athletics at Colgate University, where he managed the university's programs in physical education, recreation, and competitive athletics for 25 Division I men's and women's teams, as well as intramural and club sports.

During his eight-year tenure at Colgate, where Roach earned UnderArmor Athletic Director of the Year honors in 2009-2010, the Raiders placed 14 teams in NCAA tournaments and captured 17 Patriot League titles or ECAC championships. Colgate student-athletes earned 18 All-American honors and 34 students were named Academic All-American scholars. In 2010-11, Colgate was No. 1 in NCAA Division I with its 100 percent graduation rate.

While at Colgate, Roach coordinated the development of a new athletic brand and mascot; enhanced Colgate's scoreboards and overall look of its athletic venues; started the Raider Academic Honor Roll honoring student-athletes for academic accomplishments; increased ticket sales for football, hockey, basketball, and lacrosse; increased revenue from corporate sponsorships from \$18,000 to more than \$200,000 per year; and signed an agreement with Time Warner Cable Sports to televise selected athletic events.

Roach has also been very active in shaping the landscape of intercollegiate athletics, being appointed to a four-year term on the NCAA's Playing Rules Oversight Panel beginning in September of 2017 and serving on the Atlantic 10 Finance Committee. He has been a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) board since 2006, serving as president in 2010-2011 and, prior to that, was a member of the NACDA Executive Committee as an officer from 2006-2010. Roach was appointed to the NACDA/USOC committee which strives to enhance the relationship between the USOC and intercollegiate athletics and serves on the Board of Directors for the U.S. International University Sports Federation (US-IUSF), a governing body for the U.S. in all FISU events, such as the World University Games and the World University Championships.

In the past, Roach served on the NCAA Diversity Leadership Strategic Planning Committee, the NCAA Management Council, the NCAA Championships and Competition Cabinet, the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee, the NCAA FCS Football Championship Committee, the joint NCAA OSL Sub Committee with the U.S. Olympic Committee and the National Governing Bodies and as chair of both the NCAA Swimming and Diving Committee and the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee.

Prior to Colgate, Roach served as the Director of Athletics at Brown University for 14 years. In 2002, Brown's athletics program was honored by U.S. News & World Report as one of the top 20 athletics programs in the nation.

Under his tutelage, Brown won seven national championships and 58 Ivy League/Eastern titles with the Bears appearing in 34 NCAA championships. Seven Brown student-athletes received NCAA or NACDA Post Graduate Scholarships.

Roach created the school's first Student Athlete Advisory Board at Brown and implemented new sports marketing/promotions programs, including a new athletic logo and corporate sponsorship program. He helped increase endowment for athletics from \$10 million to \$45 million and oversaw \$16 million in capital improvements.

At both schools, Roach instituted a program where each varsity team adopted a local school. The student-athletes mentor the students at the school, helping guide them academically and help the classroom teacher achieve the set goals for the school year.

Prior to his time as an athletic director, Roach served as the head swimming coach at the University of Tennessee from 1986-1990 and at Brown from 1978-1986. At Tennessee, he was named SEC Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1989, coached 26 All-Americans and had a 23-13-1 dual meet record. He helped improved the Volunteers' national recognition by moving the program from 39th to fourth at the NCAA Division I Championship.

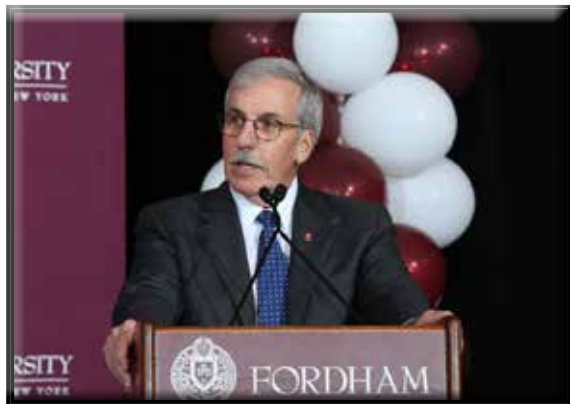
As the head coach at Brown, Roach guided the Bruins to a 74-6-1 dual meet record, three Ivy League team championships and two Eastern team titles.

Roach was inducted into the Rhode Island Aquatic Hall of Fame in 1988, the Brown University Hall of Fame in 1989 and received a Springfield College Distinguished Alumnus Award in 2018. In 1985, he was appointed as assistant coach of the United States National Swimming Team which competed at the World University Games in Kobe, Japan.

A native of Waterbury, Conn., Roach received his bachelor's degree from Springfield College in 1971, and earned a master of science degree in physical education from the school in 1972. He was a member of the Springfield College men's varsity swimming team that won three consecutive New England Conference championships, serving as the team's co-captain in 1971.

After receiving his master's degree in 1972, Roach served in the United States Marine Corps from 1972-75 attaining the rank of Captain.

Roach and his wife, Anne, have three daughters, Elizabeth, Michelle and Alexandra.





Charlie Elwood

Deputy Director of Intercollegiate Athletics

Charlie Elwood, former Senior Associate Athletic Director at St. John's University, is in his 19th year at Fordham University, his eighth as the Deputy Director of Athletics. He served the previous eleven years as the Director of Athletic Administration, being named to the post in July of 2001.

Elwood oversees the comprehensive day-to-day internal operations of the Athletic Department. These responsibilities include fiscal management, facility and event management, scheduling, personnel administration, compliance, assisting in the strategic planning process for the department, sports information and the intramural, recreation and club sport programs.

A member of the NCAA Division I men's soccer committee from 2006-2010, Elwood served as the Chairman of the committee from 2008-09. On the conference scene, Elwood served two three-year stints on the Atlantic 10 men's soccer championships committee, serving as chair of the committee in 2005-06 and 2008-09. For the past five years, Elwood has been the co-chair of the committee.

Elwood was promoted to Senior Associate Athletic Director at St. John's in December 2000 after serving as Associate Athletic Director/External Affairs since July of 1997. He joined the University in February 1996, after eight years in the Department of Athletics at the College of William & Mary.

At St. John's he was responsible for overseeing the areas of marketing, advertising, fundraising, ticketing, sports information, business office and the equipment room for St. John's 21 intercollegiate sports. He served as the liaison with Madison Square Garden for scheduling and game operations and was the scheduling administrator for Men's Basketball. He was also the Director of Licensing for the University.

Elwood served as the Tournament Manager of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament First/Second Rounds at Nassau Coliseum in March 2001, hosted by St. John's. In that capacity, Elwood managed all operations of the NCAA Championships, from travel and lodging for competing teams to media and game operations as well as fiscal responsibility for the tournament.

Elwood had been a member of the BIG EAST men's soccer committee since 1997 and served as its chair through the 2000-01 academic year.

He joined the University in 1996 as Associate Athletic Director/Athletic Business Affairs. In that position, he oversaw all elements of the business office, ticket office, facilities, game operations and the equipment room.

Prior to his arrival at St. John's, Elwood served as Assistant Athletic Director of Business Affairs at the College of William & Mary from November 1988 to February 1996. He was responsible for supervising financial operations of the business department and ticket operations.

A graduate of Fordham University, Elwood began his career in Chicago in 1982 at DePaul, when he was hired to work as Director of Business Affairs. He worked there for six years (1982-88), before leaving to take the position at William & Mary. He received his master of science in sports administration from Biscayne (Fla.) College in 1981 and his MBA in marketing from DePaul University in 1986.

Charlie and his wife, Carolyn, are the proud parents of two daughters, Blake, a 2019 Fordham graduate who was a member of the track and field team, and Kylie, a junior at Fordham and a member of the Fordham crew.

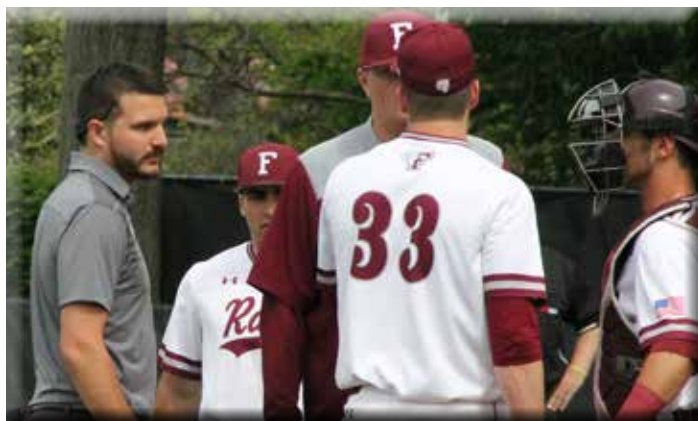

JACK COFFEY



Jack Coffey, a name that is synonymous with Fordham Athletics, served as Graduate Manager of Athletics for thirty-two years and varsity baseball coach for thirty-seven years before retiring from both posts in 1958.

Born on January 28, 1888, three miles east of the Fordham campus in what was then known as Westchester Village, Coffey attended Morris High School and Fordham College, graduating with an A.B. degree in 1910 and later earning a law degree in 1923 from Fordham Law School.

Following graduation, he underwent what he called "a prolonged series of peregrinations to points provincial" as baseball player and manager.

He returned to Fordham in 1922 as baseball coach and in 1926 became the Graduate Manager of Athletics (Athletic Director). He directed the baseball team to five Eastern titles while producing such outstanding major leaguers as Hank Borowy, Babe Young and Johnny Murphy. He is the all-time winningest baseball coach in Fordham history with an amazing 1,095-461-11 record for his 44 years of coaching. With that record, he won over 70% of the games he coached.

With Coffey as Graduate Manager of Athletics, Fordham pushed forward to national prominence in other fields of sports, notably football, track and basketball. Under his guidance, Fordham football squads appeared in the Sugar and Cotton Bowls, while Maroon basketball teams participated in both the NCAA and National Invitation Tournament twice.

Coffey was elected to the Helms Foundation Collegiate Baseball Hall of Fame in 1954 and was also among the first class of inductees to the Fordham University Athletic Hall of Fame in 1971.

The baseball field was named in his honor in 1954 and when Fordham restored football in 1964, the football Rams also called Coffey Field home. The plaque dedicated that day in 1954 summed up what Jack Coffey meant to Fordham and to Fordham men. It hails the pensioner as "A true sportsman scholar and Christian gentleman."

Houlihan Park has been the home for the Fordham baseball team since its most recent renovation in 2005. Then-named Jack Coffey Field, for the longtime Fordham baseball coach, the facility underwent a \$4.3 million renovation, which included a new drainage system, a new FieldTurf surface, a new scoreboard and sound system, and lights. In addition, new bullpens, recessed dugouts, a 500-seat grandstand, a press box and a renovated entrance were also a part of the new look of the complex.

The baseball field was renamed Houlihan Park, after Jim Houlihan '74 and his family pledged \$1 million to Fordham University's baseball program. The donation supported Fordham baseball in its efforts to establish and sustain a national recruiting program, provide additional resources for team travel and supplement equipment purchases that exceed the annual budget. The Houlihan family has strong roots at Fordham. Jim Houlihan pitched for the Rams from 1971 to 1973, and his brother Jack Houlihan (CBA '75) was a catcher from 1972 to 1975, while six other members of the Houlihan extended family have attended Fordham.

Houlihan Park's first full season of use was 2006, when the field played host to the Atlantic 10 Baseball Championship. It was the first time that the Championship returned to a campus site in its entirety since 1986. In that championship, Saint Louis garnered its first-ever Atlantic 10 Baseball Championship over St. Bonaventure. The Championship returned to Houlihan Park for a second time in 2012, where the title game between Richmond and Dayton was

broadcast nationally on CBS Sports Network. The Atlantic 10 Championship has also taken place at Houlihan Park in 2016 and returned in 2019 with the Fordham Rams capturing the 2019 Championship.

In 2012, Houlihan Park got another new addition with a full-color video scoreboard, made by Daktronics. The new display has the ability to show video, in game statistics, and more. In summer 2014, the surface of Houlihan Park was replaced, while a new outfield wall and batting cage area (behind right field) were installed. In addition, a Daktronics sound system was installed on top of the scoreboard.

Since its re-opening, Houlihan Park has served as a great home field advantage for the Rams, as Fordham have posted a 217-131 record through 2019 and won 62% of its home games.
